





Atheism in Buddhism and Nietzsche as Challenges to the Philosophy of Religion

This lecture seeks to clarify the status of Buddhism as a nontheistic religion, that is, a set of religious concerns that aren't supported by the various structures of theism: the creator God, divine beings, and corresponding practices such as worship, obedience, and supplication. Comparing Buddhist non-theism to atheism in the West we summarize Friedrich Nietzsche's "death of God" proclamation, his critique of both Christianity and Buddhism, and the patterns of cultural nihilism associated with them. These reflections are directed toward a challenge to the contemporary philosophy of religion in its incapacity to understand religion on broader, more historical grounds than theism can provide.



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
