This talk compares religious responses to death in the U.S./Mexico borderlands and the marine borders of Haiti. It considers how the lost and disappeared are mourned and honored in marginalized spaces by marginalized people. Drawing from ethnographic and historical sources, it explores how these communities adapt their beliefs and rituals in the face crisis.
